Pray for these men and their addresses, then bring your friends along, so that this will be an effective means of communicating the Gospel.

By the time you receive this Mr Ian Hore-Lacy, one of the graduates who tour around to the EUs and CEs throughout Australia, should be in Perth. He will be here until the end of July, and will be staying at Kingswood College. Please pray that God will use him to encourage Christians to be more faithful in their relationship with the Lord Jesus and to point out clearly to non-Christians the challenge of the Gospel.

The Annual General Meeting will be held on Wednesday Aug. 3rd here we will elect the E.U. committee for the next 12 months. The committee is responsible to both serve and to lead the union in doing the Lord's work in the University. It is important that we pray and think seriously about this matter, and that we take action to ensure that those we think should serve on the committee are nominated.

#### WHO MOVED THE STONE?
